The 2019/20 season saw gains in playing numbers at junior level, changes to our premier competition through engagement with Waikato-Valley and Hamilton and the ongoing consolidation and development of initiatives to promote cricket in the CMCA area.

On the staffing front our Pathway and Community Development Managers Spencer Cramer and Serena Somlyai have, in their second year, continued to develop the opportunities provided by their respective roles. Both are making a fine contribution to CMCA activity. During the summer we were pleased to welcome Kevin Parekh to a seasonal role, providing the Association with administrative support.

Continuing with staffing, March saw the resignation of our long serving CEO/ General Manager, Trevor Gill. Trevor must be acknowledged for his huge contribution to CMCA over a 12 year period during which he established strong operational systems and ensured the ongoing financial viability of the association. Throughout his time Trevor was a strong advocate for CMCA at both Northern Districts and New Zealand Cricket levels.

With Trevor's resignation, the period of lockdown allowed time for the board to reflect on our staffing needs going forward. Two options presented themselves:

- Restricting our staffing to a purely administrative level
- Making an appointment that allowed us to address fully the challenges and opportunities for growing the game in the CMCA area

Following deliberations, it was decided that the latter was the preferred option and accordingly Peter Zanzottera was appointed as Cricket Manager to address the following key areas:

- Developing stakeholder relationships
- Supporting the growth of our volunteer base
- Strategic management of funding
- Providing support to the Pathway and Development managers
- Facilitating the considerable opportunities for the game of cricket in the future, due to the substantial, population growth in the region

In my report on the 2018/2019 season I made reference to the Northern Districts proposal to centralise District Association administrative functions. This is an item that remains on the table.

Whilst acknowledging that there is merit in the concept your board remains cautious with regard to local identity and understanding of the Counties Manukau context. Currently, Northern Districts is looking to work in a collaborative way with its District Associations to ensure a degree of local autonomy in the delivery of community cricket.

The pre-Christmas combined premier competition proved a successful initiative providing both variety and an increase in the competitive nature of games. The one reservation perhaps was the travel involved in getting to games. Notwithstanding the previous point, feedback overall was positive and this initiative is planned to continue in the new season.

In consideration of the potential challenges for the game as a result of the impacts of the environment brought about by Covid 19 the board decided to draw on reserves to support clubs and their members in the coming season. To achieve this it was resolved that team registration fees and player levies would be waived for all clubs for the 2020/2021 season. In taking this action, the board believed it would provide clubs with the best opportunity to set subscriptions at a level that would support both player retention and recruitment.

Our annual accounts again show an acceptable result for the Association. That said the over reliance on grants' funding remains an issue. Given the potential impact of Covid- 19 on the availability of gaming funding this will be an increased challenge in the next financial year.

## Premiers

The Premier season, like the rest of the competitions were slightly curtailed due to the Covid-19 enforced early ending but up to that point, and exciting summer of cricket had unfolded.

The Duthie Cup had to be decided via the points table and Puke-Metro held an impressive lead at seasons end seeing them crowned champions, this was their second trophy of the campaign after a nail biting win in the Inder Lynch T20 final, as a fightback with the ball left Karaka 2 runs shy of victory.

No trifecta for the boys in green though as Manukau, led by Premier Points table top dogs Sandeep Patel and Le-Shur Vermeulen finished 20 points clear in the W.H Taylor Shield when the season came to it's close.

The winners of the Warin Cup, which is awarded to the team with the best record overall for the season was rightfully taken out by Puke-Metro.

## Senior A

The one day Manchester Shield Competition was a very tight affair with just 6 points separating the top 3 teams, but in the end Papakura kept their nose in front and headed off Manukau and Puke-Metro to claim top spot.

The two day Allan Walker Trophy wasn't quite as tight as Manukau were the dominant team throughout the summer finishing 34 points clear of Puke Metro, whilst in the 4 team T20 competition the boys from the Waikato – Tuakau CC took the honours.

## Senior B/Reserves

These two competitions have a famous Counties name on the cups with the Stoupe Cup and Joe Stoupe Cup being battled for. At the end of the curtailed campaign the United CC chargers topped the Joe Stoupe Cup standings, whilst the Manukau City Blue team held a commanding lead in the Stoupe Cup.

The T20 Competition has been a fantastic part of the CMCA summer programme for a number of years now, and is one of the most enjoyable grades going around. The silverware winners this year were Tuakau CC in the Championship, with the Manukau City Zoo boys grabbing the plate.

For the Junior Panel the 2019-20 season started with stepping down after many years on the panel of John Keen along with Shane Robinson. We thank them both for their contributions during their time on the panel.

Two new recruits were found in Andy Napier and Karl Lindner and they joined the remaining panel members of Louise Gavin, Keith West and Jason Williams for the 2019-2020 season.

In July, the panel meet to review the junior forum meeting outcomes and to set out meeting dates and tasks for the coming season. These tasks were much more settled and easier than previous years thanks in many ways to Age and Stage cricket being implemented for two prior seasons.

This left the panel to work through preseason ground checks, allocation of a dispensation panel and review of any minor rule changes.

One rule review was to incorporate a guide for coaches and managers for rain interrupted game days. This must have worked well as once the season began Counties Manukau Cricket brought out the sunshine and across the whole season, I believe we only had one rained off weekend.

So much for rain guidance requirements!

In late September, the panel meet to review junior team submissions from clubs. It was also good to see another increase in player numbers across the junior grades.

The junior season commenced and with only minor queries from clubs Pre-Christmas. Post-Christmas the panel meet in late January to review the grades and decide on semi-finals and finals weekends. Little did we know of the impending disruption Covid 19 would have on the final few weeks of the cricket season.

However overall, it was another successful and great season of CMCA junior cricket. However, Covid 19 continues to disrupt and apply new norms to our everyday life and included the panels ability to hold a junior forum meeting which was delayed until restrictions allowed group gatherings.

If there is one positive outcome of Covid-19 it has allowed us the possibility of pausing, reviewing the goals, philosophies, and terms of reference for the junior panel and junior cricket in Counties Manukau.

The panel have taken steps towards this and are current working with CMCA on developing new terms of reference that best fit the overall goals of community cricket.

Looking forward to junior cricket for 2020-2021 in my opinion the challenges remain the same. Such as.

- Remain a relevant sport in amongst numerous options available to children today
- Encourage and increase participation in a range of cricket activities for all ages
- Focus on girls cricket - the women's world cup is still scheduled to take place in New Zealand in 2022
- Continue to provide a safe and welcoming environment for children and to play and enjoy the game of cricket

Perhaps the biggest challenge we all face is the impact of Covid-19 on community sport.

Maybe cricket is fortunate in that it has the advantage of seeing other sports face the everchanging Covid-19 landscape over the winter season and be able to use the learnings from this and adapt community cricket before our 2020-2021 season begins.

Food for thought, but I for one am looking forward to seeing children of all ages back out in the sunshine playing cricket in 2020-2021.

The 2019/20 season saw a lot of new opportunities to work with schools in our community. CMCA continued building relationships and worked with 52 schools to provide over 12,000 children with the chance to have a go at cricket, either through a taster session, school cricket programme or at a festival day. Our three school deliverers, Marcel Marconi, Matt Gardiner and Lloyd Jefferson do a fantastic job and we received great feedback from schools and the children participating. We are looking to continue building on the momentum created and get more children involved in playing cricket this coming season.

Festival Days became a key focus for us. These days are designed for children to have a go at playing games of cricket. Each school brings along teams to participate, and they get to play up to six mini games throughout the day. We continued working with school clusters to grow participation at these days and saw 450 children playing games. Unfortunately, due to Covid-19 we were unable to complete the last two festival days but are looking forward to running them again next season.

A new initiative we began this season was running Afterschool Hubs at clubs. It was important to have a participation option for children who gave cricket a go at school and wanted to continue learning about the game. We also wanted to grow the school-club links as this is an important connection in growing club participation. We ran 8

hubs at different clubs across the district in both Term 4 and Term 1 and saw around 150 children.

The Yeah! Girls initiative continued this season with Vanessa Sammons employed to lead it. The programme focuses on delivering fun cricket-based sessions to encourage female participation in cricket. We saw great opportunities open up and girls really keen to participate. We worked with five schools in Term 1 and saw 117 girls attending the programme. We will be continuing to run girls programmes across the CMCA region in 2020/21.

We continued running a High School competition on Wednesdays afterschool during Term 4 and Term 1. We had 5 secondary schools participating and this provided opportunities for students to be able to play more cricket. It was great seeing how passionate the students were representing their school. We continue to work with new schools to expand the competition for the upcoming season. Our secondary schools also competed in a series of tournaments to contest the Gillette Cup, Venus Cup and Junior Gillette Cup.

Last season NZC introduced a new coaching initiative to qualify all junior coaches to ensure coaches were creating safe, enjoyable environments for children to participate. It has been great seeing coaches get on board with this and provid-

ing great sessions that children really enjoy. We have some great coaches in our community, and this is so important for the growth of our game.

In June we ran our Junior Forum to gain feedback from clubs on how the season went as well as to talk through new ideas for the next season. It was great having representation from all clubs and it was really positive hearing feedback around the season. It's great to see how hard all the clubs are working to grow participation and I'm excited to see what the 2020/21 season holds.
